DAY 2 - QUEEN ELIZABETH, AT SEA

Sitting on a beautiful stretch of Tasmania's North West Coast, the port city of Burnie may have industrial roots, but it has since reinvented itself as a creative enclave and the state's fourth-largest city. With about 40 percent of Tasmania designated as a World Heritage Area of national parks and reserves, you can enjoy the wide range of wilderness experiences available from this laid-back market town. DAY 4 – QUEEN ELIZABETH, AT SEA

Continue your exploration of the ship and enjoy the facilities available to you. DAY 5 - QUEEN ELIZABETH, HOBART

Hobart has a distinctly European look and feel, and a unique local character. The Capital of Australia's Island State, with Mt. Wellington as its backdrop, it has plenty to offer the adventurous and the inquisitive.

There are numerous cafés and boutiques to explore, but to learn more about the area's history and culture, take a walking tour of Battery Point. Led by a local guide, these tours allow visitors to take in the picturesque surroundings of the historic precinct, while learning about its inhabitants and heritage.

The Museum of Old and New Art, MONA, is located on the grounds of the Moorilla Winery on the outskirts of Hobart. This fascinating, and sometimes risqué, gallery is home to over 400 works of art from founder David Walsh's private collection. As a highly acclaimed attraction, MONA has been likened to Bilbao's Guggenheim Museum.

The Royal Tasmanian Botanical Gardens offer visitors 14 hectares of landscaped natural beauty, made up of flora from all over the world. This makes for a tranquil escape from the city – it's the ideal locale for a romantic stroll or some quiet reflection.

The evening is free for you to enjoy Queen Elizabeth's onboard facilities while moored in Hobart, watching the sun sink into the Derwent River behind the Tasman Bridge. (B,L,D)

DAY 6 – QUEEN ELIZABETH, HOBART

This morning, head to Salamanca Place, where you'll find the bustling Salamanca Market, which comes to life each Saturday. Beginning life as just 12 stalls in 1972, the popular street market now has over 300 vendors, and over 25,000 visitors each week. It is the ideal place to pick up some locally made handicrafts or produce such as gin and honey before reboarding, ready to depart Hobart. (B,L,D)

DAY 7 - QUEEN ELIZABETH, AT SEA

Enjoy the many facilities available to you aboard Queen Elizabeth. Revisit your favourite restaurants, catch a final on-board performance, enjoy just one more cocktail, or perhaps have a flutter in the casino. (B,L,D)

DAY 8 - QUEEN ELIZABETH, SYDNEY OPERA HOUSE

This morning, disembark in Sydney and make your way to the Four Seasons Hotel Sydney. DAY 11 - INDIAN PACIFIC, BROKEN HILL AND ADELAIDE
